Equality Act 2010

It is against the law to discriminate against anyone because of:

- being or becoming a transsexual person
- being married or in a civil partnership

- race including colour, nationality, ethnic or national origin
- religion, belief or lack of religion/belief
- sex

These are called 'protected characteristics'. You're protected from discrimination:

- when using public services
- when buying or renting property
- As a member or guest of a private club or association

You're legally protected from discrimination by the Equality Act 2010.

Disability

Where someone meets the definition of a disabled person in the Equality Act 2010 (the Act) employers are required to make reasonable adjustments to any elements of the job which place a disabled person at a substantial disadvantage compared to non-disabled people.

Definition of disability under the Act

The general definition of disability for the purposes of the Act is a physical or mental impairment which has a substantial and long-term adverse effect on a person's ability to carry out normal day-today activities. The Act defines long-term in this context as having lasted, or being likely to last for at least 12 months or the rest of the person's life.

What adjustments might an employer have to make?

The Act does not list the sorts of adjustments that you might have to make, but examples might be:

- -providing recruitment literature in large print;
- -providing in interview situations extra equipment at reasonable cost, removing movable barriers like furniture, or holding the interview in a different, wheelchair accessible room;
- -allowing a guide or hearing dog into the workplace;
- -purchasing specialist equipment, such as an ergonomic chair;
- -discounting disability-related sickness leave for the purposes of absence management;
- -providing additional supervisory guidance / support;
- -including a disabled parking space in the car park;
- -allowing different start and end times to the working day.
