Character Measurement System (CMS)

Dear Parent Carer,

At St Robert of Newminster Catholic School we are committed to the personal development and character education of our students as much as their academic development and education. As a major part of this commitment, the school have invested a great deal of resources in developing the CMS online platform in partnership with Character First. CMS will measure the character development of our students as it progresses throughout their time at St Robert of Newminster.

How does CMS work?

CMS will keep track of your participation in activities, trips, programmes, workshops, or anything else which works on attributes which relate to our school values of:

CMS will create a 'Character CV' which supports your qualifications and helps you with applications for college, university and work. Programmes have been developed for students to complete that link to the school values and associated attributes. Once completed the student will log their completion onto the CMS and the attributes for that programme will be recorded. A list of all the attributes linked to the 6 is demonstrated on the Tutorial and within CMS.

What you need to do as a parent?

1. Encourage your son/daughter to use the tutorial to log onto the CMS.
2. Consider from the suggested activities what he/she can choose to complete (programme list is also below).
3. On completion, encourage use of the tutorial to log the completion of the activity.
4. Select another activity from the list. When selecting, encourage your son/daughter to look at the attributes each activity works on and select which activity to do based on the attributes you feel you need to work on most.
5. Continue to use CMS to log all your extra-curricular activities throughout your time at St Robert of Newminster Catholic School.

Students will also have the option to select 'other activity out of school hours' which will allow them to self-record activities they are involved with outside of school either on a regular or ad hoc basis. Attributes are therefore chosen by the student and the activity is recorded on their CMS.
