Remote Education Summary: St Robert of Newminster Catholic School and Sixth Form College.

Following the first few days of remote education, will my child be taught broadly the same curriculum as they would if they were in school?

In the main we teach the same curriculum remotely as we do in school where possible. However, we have needed to make adaptations in some practical subjects, such as Food, PE, DT, Drama and Music.

Accessing remote education: How will my child access any online remote education you are providing?

Microsoft Teams-via students 0365 account. Students will receive notifications via their school email account alerting them to any live lessons they should attend remotely. It is vital that they attend and participate fully. It is imperative that students check their email and Team channel regularly. Students will be expected to complete all work set, meet deadlines and submit any work that requires feedback to their teachers. Our <u>Teams Learning Portal</u> has student guides and videos on how to access live lessons and access student email accounts.

How will my child be taught remotely?

Remote Learning Systems for Year 7-9:

Should any student be required to isolate for a limited amount of time due to a **Covid related issue** students will be able to access **uploaded work** from each subject class team. Teachers will upload a knowledge organiser with linked tasks to complete. Students will find these pinned to conversation/home page of each subject team. Students must follow their normal timetable and complete the work in their books. Teachers will check students completed work when they return to school. In addition, teachers will have Teams open during the lesson to answer any questions should students need any help. Students should use the chat function for this.

Remote Learning Systems for Year 10-13:

Should any student be required to isolate for a limited amount of time due to a **Covid related issue** students will be able to access uploaded work from each subject class team. Teachers will upload the work that they would normally being doing in class. This will be uploaded to conversation/homepage of each subject team. This will enable students to continue to follow their normal curriculum. Students must complete work in their books, and this will be checked by their teachers when they return to school. Teachers will have Teams open during the lesson to answer any questions should students need any help. Students should use the chat function for this.

Practical Subjects: Design and Technology, Food & Nutrition, Music, Art, and PE.

Should live teaching be agreed for certain students these subjects will not be live streaming **practical lessons**. Should students have a timetabled practical lesson they must access uploaded resources in the class teams and complete the work in their exercise books. **Theory lessons** in these subjects *will* be live streamed and students can join remotely to access the live lesson. Students must check the appropriate Team channel to ensure they are aware of what to do when they have these subjects. For core PE at KS3 and KS4 there are no live streamed lessons and students should access uploaded work from the class team. GCSE PE theory lessons will be live streamed.

Access to Remote Learning due to illness:

Students who are absent for <u>non-Covid</u> related illness will **not have access to live streamed lessons or uploaded work.** Should your child be absent from school they must speak to their teacher upon return and organise how to catch up the work.

Should your child happen to be absent for an **extended period** please contact your child's Head of House to discuss this matter and arrangements **may** be made to access live teaching.

In the event of a whole school closure:

Teachers will stream lessons live, enabling students to join remotely from home. Students must follow their normal timetable each day and join the live Teams lessons where scheduled. The duration of each lesson will be 50 minutes. This will allow for a short screen break and time for students to access their next lesson. There may be occasions where teachers are unable to stream live lessons. If this is the case, students will be informed on the Team channel and given further instructions.

Engagement and feedback: What are your expectations for my child's engagement?

In the event of a whole school closure:

Students must be punctual to the online lesson. Please note the school day begins with registration at 8.45am prompt, ending at 8.55am. The first lesson then begins at 9.05am. If a student is late for unavoidable reasons, or unable to access the live lessons that day parents/carers should contact school and inform us of the reason. To do this please contact the school and select 'Option 1 – Report a Pupil absence'. Parents must telephone by 9:00 am and provide a full explanation for the absence. Please explain if the absence is due to illness, other personal circumstances or if it is a technical issue in accessing lessons. Attendance during this period will be monitored in the same way as our usual attendance procedures. Students must also follow the Teams Code of Conduct. This is available in the "Teams Learning Portal" section of the school website.

How can parents and carers provide support at home?

Please continue to support us, by ensuring your child is fully prepared for the day. Students must complete their work in their exercise books. Students must have their equipment ready for each lesson. If your child does not have their exercise book please complete the work on paper. Please help students get organised for the week. It would be useful to set up a work station and somewhere quiet to study. Our <u>Teams Learning Portal</u> has student guides and videos on how to access live lessons and access student email accounts. Our weekly parental newsletter will provide parents with further advice and support.

How will you assess my child's work and progress?

In the event of a whole school closure:

Students will be getting ongoing formative feedback through questioning and retrieval quizzes in live lessons. Students will be receiving regular written feedback on their work. Students will be required to submit work in various ways. Subjects may ask students to submit work via a MS Form link sent to them by their teacher, or to submit work via a MS Assignment link, this may require students to upload a Word document or an image of their work. Students will then receive written feedback which they can view within the MS Teams system.

How you work with families to deliver remote education for pupils with SEND.

In the event of a whole school closure:

Students and parents will receive regular calls from a member of the SEN team to check in with them and support families to adapt the home learning offer to meet their child's needs. Teaching staff will continue to differentiate resources and activities that are tailored to the needs and targets of each child. For children with EHCP plans they will always be encouraged to be in school full time. All referrals and assessments that we can facilitate will continue to take place in line with our schools COVID 19 risk assessment.
