SMSC Intent

SMSC at St Robert's is based upon providing all students with the following opportunities:

Spiritual:

The opportunity to explore beliefs, experience and faiths, feelings, and values; enjoy learning about oneself, others and the surrounding world; use imagination and creativity and reflect on experiences.

Moral:

The opportunity to learn what is right and wrong and respect the law; understand consequences; investigate moral and ethical issues and offer reasoned views.

Social:

The opportunity to use a range of social skills to participate in the local community and beyond; appreciate diverse viewpoints; participate, volunteer, and cooperate; resolve conflict.

Cultural:

The opportunity to explore and appreciate cultural influences; appreciate the role of Britain's parliamentary system; participate in cultural opportunities; understand, accept, respect, and celebrate diversity.

SMSC Implementation

Implementation of SMSC will take place across all curriculum areas, through our co-curriculum opportunities, through our pastoral system and through our personal development programme. These will all include activities that encourage pupils to recognise the spiritual, moral, social, and cultural dimension of their learning.

Practical Activities to develop SMSC:

- Daily morning prayer and reflection (focus on the school values)
- Weekly collective worship (assembly)
- Events celebrating the different liturgical seasons
- Religious Education taught to all pupils from Year 7-13
- Careers education and full time Careers Advisor
- Weekly taught PSHE curriculum and RSE curriculum
- Chaplaincy (Social Justice Group, Inclusivity Group and Leadership opportunities)
- Inter House Competition (termly events such as 'Remembrance Creative Arts')
- Retreat opportunities for Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4
- Trips & Visits offered through departments
- Aspire Co-Curriculum (supporting the academic endeavours of our students)

- Community Co-Curricular programme (opportunities to work with outside agencies locally and nationally)
- Creative Co-Curriculum (Art, Music and Drama)
- Active Co-Curriculum (Team St Robert's)
- Additional Co-curriculum support
- School Council
- Anne Frank Trust 'Voices of Equality' St Robert's is a beacon school for this organisation

SMSC Impact

The provision of Spiritual, Moral and Cultural development is monitored by the Senior Management Team, together with Heads of Department and Heads of House. We have not identified performance indicators, but rather colleagues are asked to provide specific examples of student experiences. These experiences are showcased through our termly ethos magazine, our Catholic School Inspection Evaluation Document, our Personal Development Programme, our Co-Curricular activities, and our taught Academic Curriculum.
